**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act exempting human services nonprofits from EMAC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 189A of Chapter 149, as established by Chapter 63 of the Acts of 2017, is hereby
2 amended at the end by inserting the following 2 paragraphs:

3 “The director of unemployment assistance shall develop a waiver to fully exempt
4 community-based human services organizations holding purchase-of-service contracts with the
5 Executive Office of Health and Human Services, Executive Office of Elder Affairs, Department
6 of Early Education and Care and the Department of Housing and Community Development from
7 paying the Employer Medical Assistance Contribution (EMAC) Supplement.”

8 “The above hardship waiver that is developed shall allow community-based human
9 services organizations holding purchase-of-service contracts with the Executive Office of Health
10 and Human Services, Executive Office of Elder Affairs, Department of Early Education and

- 11 Care and the Department of Housing and Community Development to be fully exempt from
- 12 making any payments under the EMAC Supplement.”
