Highlighting MassCOSH's Impact on the Community

At the Council, we are proud to highlight the achievements of our members who are driving change in the community. This membership Monday, as part of our yearlong celebration of the Providers' Council's 50th anniversary, we're shining a spotlight on Mass COSH.

Who is MassCOSH and What Do They Do?

The Massachusetts Coalition for Occupational Safety & Health (MassCOSH) is committed to protecting workers by advocating for stronger workplace protections, providing training and resources, and organizing for systemic change. They bring together workers, labor unions, legal experts, and public health advocates to address unsafe job conditions and fight for policies that protect employees.

MassCOSH focuses on supporting those most vulnerable to workplace hazards, including immigrant workers, young workers, low-wage employees, emergency responders, and families of workers who have lost their lives on the job.

They provide essential programs and services, including:

- **Training and Technical Assistance** – Provides workplace safety training and resources to help workers identify hazards and develop solutions
- **Union Education and Organizing** – Enhances unions' ability to advocate, organize, and mobilize for safer and healthier workplaces.
- **Families of Fallen Workers Support Services** – Supports families who have lost loved ones to workplace tragedies by offering guidance on workers' compensation, OSHA investigations, and other resources.
- **Healthy Schools Initiative** – Improving environmental and occupational health conditions in schools across the state.
- **Immigrant Worker Center** – Providing resources and advocacy for immigrant workers to ensure safe and healthy work conditions.
- **Teens Led at Work** – A youth leadership program that educates young workers on safety and labor rights.



When Did MassCOSH Join The Providers' Council and Why?

MassCOSH has been a valued member of the Providers' Council for several years, working to strengthen advocacy efforts, expand its reach, and collaborate with like-minded organizations.
