S.130 | H.223




TCF Advocacy Wins

- Secured \$207 Million for Ch.257 Rate Reserve Fund
- Pay Disparity Report Released
- UMass x Caring Force Research Report Coming Next Year!
- Our bills have been reportedly favorably by the Committee on Children, Family & Persons w. Disabilities
 - AN ACT RELATIVE TO A LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM FOR HUMAN SERVICE WORKERS S.119 | H.283
 - This bill has been reported favorably to both the Senate and House Ways and Means Committee
 - AN ACT RELATIVE TO A LIVABLE WAGE FOR HUMAN SERVICES WORKERS S.130 | H.223
 - This bill has been reported favorably to both the Senate Ways and Means Committee. They have until November 21 to report to House Ways & Means




































T-Shirt Design Contest Highlights

- 1st and 2nd place designs avaliable on our storefront













An act relative to a loan
repayment program for human
service workers (Bill No. S.119
H.283) has been reported
favorably from the Committee
on Children, Families and
Persons with Disabilities to both




the Senate and House Ways and Means Committees.

The Committee on Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities has also favorably reported *An act relative to a livable wage for human services* workers (Bill No. <u>S.130</u> | <u>H.223</u>) to the Senate Ways and Means Committee. The House still until Friday, November 21 to report on the bill.


If reported favorably by the Ways and Means Committees, the bills will reach floor debate.











What is your role at your organization?
















Did you reach out to your legislator this year through a Caring Force campaign?


