June 1-3

Shavuot is a Jewish feast that commemorates the spring harvest and the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai.

June 4-8

The Hajj is an annual pilgrimage to the holy city of Mecca, which Muslims are called to do at least once in their lifetime if they are able to.

June 6-7

<u>Eid al-Adha</u> (The Feast of Sacrifice) is an Islamic holy day when Muslims remember the sacrifice made by the Prophet Ibraham.

June 8

National Puerto Rican Day Parade is a demonstration of cultural pride in honor of the 3.5 million inhabitants of Puerto Rico and over 5 million people residing in the United States.

June 8

Race Unity Day is recognized in the Baha'i faith as a day to promote racial harmony and understanding.

June 11

<u>Strawberry Moon</u> is one of 13 thanksgiving celebrations recognized by many Native American communities.

June 12

Loving Day commemorates the anniversary of the court decision that legalized interracial marriage.





June 12

Anne Frank Day commemorates the birthday of Anne Frank, a Jewish girl who wrote a diary while hiding from the Nazis and eventually died in a concentration camp. Her diary became a prominent piece of the historical record of the Holocaust.

June 14

<u>Flag Day</u> is a holiday that commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States of America.

June 15

Father's Day is a day to honor fathers and celebrate paternal bonds.

June 16

<u>Martyrdom of Guru Arjan</u> is a day observed by Sikhs to commemorate the arrest, torture and death of Guru Arjan.

June 19

<u>Juneteenth</u> (Emancipation Day) commemorates the day when the news of the Emancipation Proclamation finally reached enslaved African Americans in Texas in 1865, about two years after it was originally issued.

June 20

World Refugee Day is an international day designated by the United Nations to honor refugees around the world.

June 20

<u>Litha</u> (Midsummer) is a Pagan and Wiccan festival that occurs during the summer solstice and celebrates the abundance and beauty of Mother Earth.

June 22-28

Helen Keller DeafBlind Awareness Week highlights the achievements and capabilities of DeafBlind individuals nationwide. The theme for 2025 is "Cultivating Leadership: Together We Grow."





June 26

Anniversary of the legalization of same-sex marriage (Equality Day) honors the U.S. Supreme Court decision in 2015 ruling that all same-sex marriages must be recognized nationwide.

June 26

Islamic New Year (Hijri New Year, 1st of Muharram) is the beginning of the Islamic lunar calendar and marks the time of the migration of the prophet Mohammed fled from Mecca to Medina.

June 27

Helen Keller Day celebrates the birth, life and achievements of Helen Keller, a deafblind woman who was an author, activist, leading humanitarian in the 20th century as well as one of the co-founders of the ACLU.

June 27

Feast of the Sacred Heart (The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus) is a Catholic solemnity that celebrates devotion to Jesus' heart and his divine love for all of humanity.
