Día de Los Muertos Originating with the Aztecs, the Mexican Day of the Dead is a unique blend of Mesoamerican and Christian rituals.

November 1

All Saints' Day (also called All Hallows or Hallowmas) is a Christian holiday that celebrates and honors all saints throughout Christian history.

November 2

All Souls' Day is a Christian holiday that focuses on those who have departed and are being cleansed in purgatory.

Coronation Day (Anniversary of the Crowning of Haile Selassie) is the day when Haile Selassie ascended the Ethiopian throne. This is one of the holiest days in the Rastafarian year.

Election Day is a day set by U.S. law for the election of public officials. This year will include gubernatorial and state legislative elections in some states, as well as some mayoral races and others.

November 5

Falling Leaves/Hunting Moon is one of 13 thanksgiving celebrations recognized by many Native American communities.

November 5

Guru Nanak Ji was the founder of Sikhism and the first of the Sikh Gurus. His birth is celebrated worldwide on the day of **Kartik Purnima** as per the Hindu lunar calendar.

November 11

Veteran's Day is a celebration to honor United States military veterans.

November 16

International Day for Tolerance was founded by the U.N. to encourage respect among various people regardless of culture, language, religion, or ethnicity.

Dutch American Heritage Day celebrates the connection between the Netherlands and the United States and recognizes the influence of Dutch culture on US culture and history.

November 20

Transgender Day of Remembrance is an observance to honor the memory of transgender and nonbinary people killed due to anti-trans hate and violence.

November 27

National Day of Mourning is a solemn occasion marked by Native American people who mourn their ancestors and the genocide of their people and theft of their lands. It is also an occasion to feel strength in action and solidarity.

Thanksgiving Day is a holiday celebrated in the U.S. when many families come together to share a feast and reflect on what they are thankful for.

November 30

St. Andrew's Feast Day St. Andrew is the patron saint of Scotland, Greece, Russia, Ukraine, Barbados, and Romania. This day honors him, his good works, and his canonization in the Catholic Church.
